"Geometric programming" GP originated in 1961 from the need for Westinghouse Electric WE to win lucrative contracts in competition with GE and other corporations -- contracts from numerous regional electricutility companies to custom-design and then fabricate large power-distribution transformers that would satisfy given consumer power demands and other constraints. Its winning strategy -developed by WE scientists Clarence Zener, Richard J. Duffin, and the speaker -minimized the combined fabrication and expected life-time operating costs via clever new mathematical manipulations of novel transformer models that used only "generalized-polynomial" objective and constraint functions.
